Holiday Trash Schedule

Dare County will be closed on Monday, January 21st in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day.



Kitty Hawk Trash Collection will take place on Tuesday and Thursday.

Commercial collection will take place on Tuesday and Friday.

Large Item Pick-up Scheduled for Monday, February 11th

Town of Kitty Hawk Public Works will be conducting Large Item Pick Up beginning on Monday, February 11th. Please have items placed in the right-of-way.

For this pick-up, the following recyclable items will be collected: used auto tires (tires must be removed from rims), used motor oil (only in spill proof containers), auto radiators, scrap metals (rims, motor parts), appliances, furniture, and mattresses and box springs. Please remove doors from refrigerators or place door side down, as to not allow entry.



The following items WILL NOT be collected:

old clothes, shoes, cardboard, etc., tree limbs, stumps, leaves, any yard-clearing debris, construction/demolition materials such as lumber, toilets, windows, doors, etc., any hazardous materials (oil based paint, pesticides, etc.) Water based paint can be picked up but must be dried out. All normal household garbage must be disposed of in your black can. The next large item pick up is scheduled for May 6th.

Moore Shore Road Living Shoreline Project Nearing Completion

The Moore Shore Road living shoreline project is currently under construction with the wooden sill portion of the project expected to be completed by mid-January. When fully completed the project will include a total of 520' linear feet of offshore sill with native marsh grasses planted behind the sill. The project is being constructed to aid in stabilizing the shoreline along Moore Shore Road while also providing natural habitat for wildlife.



The project is being constructed and funded in conjunction with the Town of Kitty Hawk, NC Coastal Federation, NC Department of Transportation, Dare County Soil and Water, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, Coastal Engineering and Surveying and private land owners.




Be fire smart

with electricity in your home.

There are approximately **45,000** home electrical fires each year.



3 in 5 home electrical fires involve lighting equipment or home electrical wiring.



Home electrical fire deaths peak between **midnight and 8 a.m.**



Peak months for electrical fire deaths are **November through March.**

Plug only 1 heat-producing appliance (such as a coffee maker, space heater or microwave) directly into a wall outlet at a time.



Never use an extension cord with a heat-producing appliance.



Extension cords should only be used temporarily. Have an electrician install additional wall outlets where you need them.

Police Officer II, Jade Hawk Selected as Officer of the Year

Police Officer II Jade Hawk was chosen by her peers as the 2018 "Employee of the Year". Officer Hawk began her career in 2015 with the Kitty Hawk Police Department and is assigned to the patrol division.



Police Officer II Garrett Driver earned the 2018 "Top Gun" award for the highest qualifying firearms scores during firearms training. Officer Driver is a US Army veteran and began his career in 2014 with the Kitty Hawk Police Department and is assigned to the patrol division.

Kitty Hawk Police Officer Successfully Resuscitates Individual

Police Officer II Christopher Simpson was presented the "Life Saving Award" by Chief Joel C. Johnson, for his actions during an emergency call involving a subject that was not responsive. Upon arrival, Officer Simpson determined that the subject was not breathing and deployed the AED (Automated External Defibrillator). He was successful in resuscitating the subject with the AED, and the subject was transported to Outer Banks Hospital for further evaluation. The subject had suffered a major heart attack.

Kitty Hawk Police Department patrol cars are equipped with the lifesaving AED device. An **automated external defibrillator (AED)** is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life threatening [cardiac arrhythmias](#) of [ventricular fibrillation](#) and [pulseless ventricular tachycardia](#), and is able to treat them through [defibrillation](#), the application of electricity which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. The Police Department is dedicated to providing excellent service to its citizens and visitors.
