If you are registered and you live in Kitty Hawk

Absentee Voting

To vote by absentee ballot, the absentee request form must be received by the Dare County Board of Elections by 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 30, 2018.

One-stop absentee voting

(Commonly known as "early voting") allows any registered voter to cast an absentee ballot in person on select days prior to Election Day. Unlike on Election Day, when registered voters can only vote at their specific precinct, one stop voting allows

registered voters to vote at *any* one-stop absentee voting site in the county. One-stop sites will have all the ballot styles for a given election at each site.

When you present to vote at a one-stop site, you may change your name or address, if it needs to be updated.

Curbside voting is offered at all Dare County polling places. To be eligible for curbside voting, you must be unable to enter the polling place due to age or physical disability. Look for the call bells near the polling place entrance labeled "Curbside Voting." Poll workers will walk to your car when you park in one of the designated spaces to attend to your voting needs.

Fall Chipping Service Begins October 15th

Please place items for chipping in right of way, prior to October 15th.

Once the chipper has gone through your area, it WILL NOT return.

Vegetative debris larger than 4 inches in diameter and 6 feet long, stumps, lumber, leaves, or yard clippings will not be collected.

Large Item Pick-up Scheduled for Monday, November 26th.

For this pick-up, the following recyclable items will be collected: used auto tires (tires must be removed from rims), used motor oil (only in spill proof containers), auto radiators, scrap metals (rims, motor parts), appliances, furniture, and mattresses and box springs. Please remove doors from refrigerators or place door side down, as to not allow entry.



The following items WILL NOT be collected: old clothes, shoes, cardboard, etc., tree limbs, stumps, leaves, any yard-clearing debris, construction/ demolition materials such as lumber, toilets, windows, doors, etc., any hazardous materials (oil based paint, pesticides, etc.) Water based paint can be picked up but must be dried out. All normal household garbage must be disposed of in your black can.



Bear Resistant Trash Cans Available

Dare County Public Works now has a limited number of bear-resistant trash cans that are available for purchase by residents in bear populated areas of the county on a first-come, first-served basis. The roll-off carts feature a special locking mechanism that make them bear-resistant and are being offered at the same rate as regular replacement cans - \$85.40 for those picked up at the Public Works office in Manteo or \$96.08 delivered.

The locking mechanism on the new carts allows the container to easily be opened by humans using one hand, but prevents bears from opening it with their claws, paws and teeth. The carts are designed to be “gravity-based,” meaning that they must be tilted at an angle of at least 270 degrees when an automated truck picks it up, so contents fall into the trash truck without extra effort.







Join Us at Our Open House!!!

Kitty Hawk Fire Captain Accepted into Executive Fire Officer Program

Kitty Hawk Fire Capt. Michael Basilone has been selected through a national application process to attend the four-year Executive Fire Officer Program offered at the National Fire Academy campus in Emmitsburg, Md.

The National Fire Academy's (NFA) Executive Fire Officer Program (EFOP) provides senior fire officers with a broad perspective on various facets of fire and emergency services administration. The courses and accompanying research examine how to exercise leadership when dealing with difficult or unique problems within communities.



As an EFOP student, Basilone will enhance his professional development through a series of four graduate and upper-division-baccalaureate equivalent courses taken over a four-year period. Each course is two weeks in length. An Applied Research Project (ARP), which relates to the organization, must be completed within six months after each of the four courses.

The National Fire Academy was created as a result of the landmark document America Burning and the subsequent passage of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974. It is estimated that, since 1975, over 1,400,000 students have received training through a variety of course delivery methods.

Kitty Hawk Police Sergeant Recognized by NC Governor's Highway Safety Program

Congratulations to Sgt. Brian Strickland who was recently presented North Carolina's Local Law Enforcement Partner of the Year Award by the North Carolina Governor's Highway Safety Program.

Director Mark M. Ezzell presented the award at this year's Traffic Safety Expo held in Wilmington. The Kitty Hawk Police Department has a rich history and relationship with the Governor's Highway Safety Program. The award recognized Sgt. Strickland for his contribution to traffic safety initiatives in northeastern North Carolina and his service as the Governor's Highway Safety Program Northeast Regional Law Enforcement Liaison. In this position he has had the opportunity to supervise twelve county wide programs and thirty law enforcement agencies' traffic safety related activities.

Sgt. Strickland was also recognized for his service to the Outer Banks Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Coalition. Since joining in 2013, he has held the position of Secretary and currently Treasurer. The Coalition facilitates the education and awareness of practical bicycle and pedestrian safety to drivers, pedestrians, cyclists and all those who live or visit the Outer Banks of North Carolina in a positive and proactive manner. Of note is the Coalition's latest project, a program that will provide every elementary and middle school student in Dare County Schools with a free bicycle helmet and lights along with a comprehensive bicycle safety curriculum.



Schedule Your Residential Security Check During Your Vacation

Residential security checks are provided to any year-round residents while they are out of town.

A uniformed Patrol Officer will inspect the residence at least once in a 24-hour period. The officer will complete an operations report after each inspection of the residence, and any abnormality discovered will be noted on the report. The duration of this service is limited to 2 weeks.
